**The Brodhead Watershed Association and the Pocono Heritage Land Trust Host Where in the Watershed Walk #3: Where the Brodhead Doubles / Bertie's Knob on Saturday April 5**

Join BWA/PHLT members/friends and naturalists Don Miller, Jeff Heberley and Brodhead Forest and Stream President, Doug Swift on Saturday, April 5 from 1 to 4 pm, for an early spring hike on Brodhead Forest and Stream property to a mountain view high above the confluence of the Upper Brodhead and Paradise creeks. This "before leaf out" hike will explore a recently timbered forest area and upland forest/dry ridge habitat. This hike will take us along moderately steep, timber roads and woodland trails, before leading "off trail" to the top of Bertie's Knob, the high point on the Paradise Forest and Stream property.

This hike will begin at the Brodhead Forest and Stream Association club house on Route 191 in Stroud Township, just after the tunnel and before the junction with Route 447 (yes the new bridge over the Brodhead Creek has been completed). Appropriate outdoor attire and hiking boots are recommended. If time permits, an option end of hike exploration will be offered to view the point where the Brodhead "doubles" at the confluence of the Upper Brodhead and Paradise Creeks. Suggested donation is \$5.00 per person (\$3.00 per BWA/PHLT member) to be collected at the start of the hike. Hike registration requested.
