Brodhead Watershed Association Presents "Chasing Wild Trout" - a Program on the Essentials of Fly Fishing at the ForEvergreen Nature Preserve in Analomink

The Brodhead Watershed Association invites everyone that has an interest in fishing to join experts, Don Baylor, Don Miller, and their friends from Trout Unlimited to learn the essentials of fly fishing, 1 pm on Saturday, June 28, at the ForEvergreen Preserve (the old Evergreen Golf Course) in Analomink.

Participants will receive hands on instruction in casting, fly fishing line tying and the use of various types of flies. Casting practice will be done on the lawn and then on the small pond (with rods provided for those who do not have their own).

The two Don's will also share the historic significance this stretch of the Brodhead Creek played as the "birthplace of American fly fishing," and the importance of the Wild Trout signage program indicating the special protection regulations promoted by the Brodhead Chapter of Trout Unlimited, the Brodhead Watershed Association and the Pocono Heritage Land Trust.

This will be a wonderful afternoon of learning how to experience the Brodhead Creek just like Zane Grey, Annie Oakley and Teddy Roosevelt did a century ago.
