Parking Area 1 Location:

From Canadensis – Travel south on PA 447 for 3.3 miles. Turn right onto Clarks Rd for 1.6 miles. Turn left onto Henry's Crossing Rd for 0.5 miles. From Tannersville – Take PA 715 north for 5.3 miles. Turn left onto PA 191 for 1.7 miles. Turn right onto Cranberry Creek Rd for 1.3 miles. Turn right onto Henry's Crossing Rd for 0.5 miles.

Parking Area 2 Location:

From Canadensis – Travel south on PA 447 for 4.8 miles.

From Tannersville – Take PA 715 north for 5.3 miles. Turn right onto PA 191 for 2.4 miles. Turn left onto PA 447 for 4.9 miles.

Enjoy this priceless open space

The Brodhead Creek is open to the public for fishing, during the season, for those with current Pennsylvania fishing license. Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission regulations apply. The property is open for walking, hiking, birdwatching, photography, picnicking, geocaching, snowshoeing, cross country skiing and hunting, in season.

Preserving water quality

This Preserve is part of more than 1,500 acres of protected land that follows the ridge line between the Paradise and Brodhead watersheds, the township boundary between Paradise and Price townships. Like other protected properties in the upper Brodhead and Paradise watersheds, this Preserve protects the drinking water supply for Stroudsburg and Stroud, Pocono and part of Hamilton and Tobyhanna townships. It also protects wildlife habitat and views, and contributes to our local tourism economy, while offering one and all the peace and beauty of spending time in nature.

How the Preserve was protected

Paradise-Price Preserve was purchased in 2011 by Paradise and Price Townships for \$3.3 million. Funding came from the Monroe County Open Space Bond Fund and the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. Pocono Heritage Land Trust was instrumental in bringing the parties together to protect this important property. The Preserve is managed by a committee appointed by Paradise and Price townships' Board of Supervisors.

Paradise-Price Preserve

Paradise & Price Townships
Natural Area



The 777 acres of the Paradise-Price Preserve straddle the watershed divide between the Paradise and Brodhead watersheds. About half of the property is in the Paradise watershed and contains headwaters tributaries of the Cranberry Creek. The other half is in the Brodhead watershed and includes a third of a mile of the Brodhead Creek and a view of Targa Falls – the only natural waterfall on the Brodhead Creek.
