More than 60 types of perennial plants and shrubs are available, including sun- and shadeloving plants, deer-resistant varieties, and butterfly magnets like milkweed. All featured plants are adapted to our area and beneficial to the local ecosystem.

Native plants need less fertilizer, use fewer pesticides, and help insects pollinate. And because they don't need as much water, these non-invasive plants help protect streams and wells, too.
