Program Requirements for the 2025-2026 Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant Program

The Department of Agriculture (Department) hereby provides notice of the standards and requirements for the Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant Program (Program).

The Program is established under authority of 3 Pa.C.S. §§ 10301—10307 (relating to agriculture and youth development) as amended by the act of July 7, 2022 (P.L. 504, No. 52), referred to as the Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant Program Act. The Program allows the Department to award direct grants and matching grants to help fund eligible projects, programs and equipment purchases conducted or made by an organization composed mainly of youth, or an organization with programs that benefit youth, and organized to promote development in the areas of agriculture, community leadership, vocational training and peer fellowship. The term includes a school district.

This notice establishes the policy guidelines for the Program. It establishes the process by which grant applications will be solicited, reviewed and awarded for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2025-2026. The amount appropriated for grants in SFY 2025-2026 will be no less than \$500,000. Funding is contingent upon 2025-2026 budget appropriations.

For the SFY 2025-2026 Program, the Department will consider an eligible applicant to be any organization composed mainly of youth or an organization with programs that benefit youth and is organized to promote development in the areas of agriculture, community leadership, vocational training and peer fellowship. The term

includes a school district. This will include but is not limited to applications from schools or school districts to help fund eligible projects conducted by or for the benefit of agriculture and youth organizations operated under the applicant school or school district. The Department may revise these policy guidelines in subsequent years, as the Department gains experience in administering the Program.

This document has been developed in consultation with the State Agriculture and Youth Development Board (Board).

1. *Program objective.* The Program's objective is to provide grants to eligible agriculture and youth organizations to help fund projects such as educational programs, work force development programs, eligible seminars and field trips, agricultural safety training programs, capital projects, equipment purchases and special projects, as approved by the Board.

2. *Definitions.* The following words and phrases apply to the Program:

Agriculture and youth organization. An organization composed mainly of youth, or an organization with programs that benefit youth, and organized to promote development in the areas of agriculture, community leadership, vocational training and peer fellowship. The term includes a school district.

Board. The State Agriculture and Youth Development Board.

Capital project. A significant expenditure to create, acquire or enhance physical assets or infrastructure. Examples of capital projects include building construction and infrastructure development.

Department. The Department of Agriculture of the Commonwealth.

Eligible project. One or more of the following, approved by the Board:

- (1) An educational or work force development program conducted by an agriculture and youth organization.
- (2) Educational or work force development seminars and field trip conducted by an agriculture and youth organization.
- (3) An agricultural safety training program conducted by an agriculture and youth organization.
- (4) A capital project or an equipment purchase for an agriculture and youth organization.

Program. The Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant Program.

3. *Eligibility.* An agriculture and youth organization may apply to the Department for a grant under the Program. For an agriculture and youth organization to be eligible to apply, most of its membership must be 24 years of age or younger or must have programming/initiatives focused on individuals 24 years of age or younger. A school or school district may apply to receive grant funds for an eligible project conducted by or for the benefit of an agriculture and youth organization that is operated under that school or school district.

4. *Scoring of applications.* The Department will evaluate each complete and timely-filed project proposal and grant application it receives, using a 100-point scale. A different scoring system will be used for scoring direct grant applications and matching grant applications. The scoring systems will be as follows:

(a) *Direct Grant Applications:*

(1) Up to 5 points for a brief narrative and background of the organization and the youth it serves and included evidence of the number of youth served.

(2) Up to 5 points for a detailed explanation of the proposed project.

(3) Up to 20 points for the details of proposed purchases for which reimbursement grant money is sought, including the following:

(i) A statement of the maximum amount of grant money sought for the project.

(ii) An itemized budget table.

(iii) A detailed budget narrative of each budget line item.

(4) Up to 25 points for a detailed project implementation schedule, or a schedule plan of equipment purchase, as appropriate for the project or purchase, with respect to which the grant is sought, including the following:

(i) Description of project activities necessary to accomplish the project objectives.

(ii) Identification of each entity that will assist in, participate in and benefit from the project.

(iii) A work plan timeline that falls within the grant period.

(5) Up to 20 points for identified measurable outcomes and performance goals of the project, including the following:

(i) How many youth will be impacted by the Program.

(ii) Measurable outcomes.

(6) Up to 25 points for projects or activities that meet the goals and objectives of the Program as described by statute and the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* notice.

(b) *Matching Grant Applications:*

(1) Up to 5 points for a brief narrative and background of the organization and the youth it serves and included evidence of the number of youth served.

(2) Up to 5 points for a detailed explanation of the proposed project.

(3) Up to 20 points for the details of proposed purchases for which reimbursement grant money is sought, including the following:

(i) A statement of the maximum amount of grant money sought for the project.

(ii) An itemized budget table, including a 50% match.

(iii) A detailed budget narrative of each budget line item.

(4) Up to 25 points for a detailed project implementation schedule and a construction schedule or an equipment purchase plan, as appropriate for the project or purchase with respect to which the grant is sought, including the following:

(i) Description of project activities necessary to accomplish the project objectives.

(ii) Identification of each entity that will assist in, participate in and benefit from the project.

(iii) A work plan timeline that falls within the grant period.

(5) Up to 20 points for identified measurable outcomes and performance goals of the project, including the following:

(i) How many youth will be impacted by the Program.

(ii) Measurable outcomes.

(iii) Performance targets.

(6) Up to 25 points for projects or activities that meet the goals and objectives of the Program as described by statute and the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* notice.

5. *Annual allocation limit for SFY 2025-2026.* The annual allocation limits for grant funds under the Program shall be as presented in the introductory section and funds will be awarded on a funds-available basis.

6. *Grant types.* There are two different types of grants that can be awarded under the Program:

(a) Direct, non-matching reimbursement grants of up to \$7,500 to defray the costs of an eligible project, other than a capital project; and

(b) Matching reimbursement grants of up to \$25,000 to defray the costs of an eligible capital project or equipment purchase, where the grant comprises no more than 50% of the eligible project costs.

7. *Limitations on grants.* The following shall apply:

(a) The amount of reimbursement is based on actual eligible costs submitted by an approved applicant for an approved project during the fiscal year in which the grants are awarded.

(b) Grant reimbursement money is limited as described in section 6.

(c) Grant reimbursement money shall not be used to reimburse any portion of an in-kind contribution to an eligible project.

(d) Grant money may not be used to pay or reimburse wages or salaries of grant recipient staff.

(e) Grant money may not be used to pay or reimburse stipends.

(f) Grant money may not be sub-awarded.

(g) Grant money may not be used to reimburse any portion of the project costs which are being paid or reimbursed under another Federal or State grant program.

8. *Application procedure.*

(a) *Online Applications Only.* An application for a grant under the Program must be submitted through the Commonwealth's Single Application for Assistance online application system at grants.pa.gov/Login.aspx.

(b) *Application Window.* Applications must be submitted through the Single Application for Assistance online application system between 8 a.m. on September 1, 2025, and 5 p.m. on October 10, 2025. Applications received outside of that application window will not be considered or reviewed.

(c) *Application Requirements.* An application for a grant under the Program must contain the following information:

(1) The applicant's name, business address and contact information.

(2) A brief narrative explaining how the applicant is an agriculture and youth organization.

(3) A statement as to whether the applicant seeks a direct, nonmatching reimbursement grant or a matching reimbursement grant, as these are described in section 6.

(4) The details of the project or equipment purchase for which reimbursement grant money is sought, including the following:

(i) A project budget.

(ii) A statement of the maximum amount of grant money sought for the project.

(iii) A project implementation schedule, a construction schedule or an equipment purchase plan, as appropriate for the project or purchase with respect to which the grant is sought.

(iv) A narrative identifying each entity that will assist in, participate in and benefit from the project.

(v) A project completion date, which shall be no later than June 30, 2027.

(5) An attestation signed by the applicant, verifying the accuracy of the information presented on the application.

9. *Disposition and review of grant applications.*

(a) The Department will review each application, and supporting documentation submitted therewith, for completeness and accuracy, and shall determine whether the application is eligible for consideration by the Board.

(b) If an application is found to be incomplete or inaccurate, the Department may request additional documentation and may discontinue further processing of the application until the requested information is received.

(c) If the Department determines an application is complete, accurate and eligible for consideration by the Board, it shall submit that application for consideration by the Board at its next scheduled meeting. The Board shall consider the project, capital project or equipment purchase that is the subject of the application and shall vote to recommend approval or disapproval of the application by the Department.

(d) The Department will consider the Board's recommendation and make the decision as to approval or disapproval of an application.

10. *Notice of disposition of application.* The Department will provide the applicant email notice of the disposition (approval or disapproval) of the application.

11. *Grant agreement.* After the Secretary of the Department approves a grant application, and as a precondition

to the Department's release of grant moneys to a successful applicant, the Department and the applicant will execute a written or electronic grant agreement which describes the terms and conditions subject to which the grant is made. The grant agreement will contain and conform to the requirements of this notice and will also contain any special terms and conditions as required by the Secretary. Among the terms of the grant agreement will be a requirement that the grant recipient provide the Department full and complete access to all records relating to the performance of the project and submit the information as the Department may require. Applicants who wish to view the full terms and conditions of the grant agreement in advance of submitting an application may contact the Department at the address set forth in section 12. Applicants who are unable to agree to the terms and conditions should not apply.

12. *Distribution of grant money.* As Program grants are reimbursement grants, the Department will not issue grant money until the successful applicant delivers the following to the Department immediately following project completion, but no later than June 30, 2027:

(a) A verified statement that the eligible project has been completed or implemented, or that the subject equipment has been purchased.

(b) A verified statement of the project completion date or the equipment purchase date.

(c) Photos of the completed or implemented project or the equipment purchased, with a narrative explanation of each photo.

(d) Bills and invoices demonstrating that expenses were incurred for which reimbursement grant funds are sought.

Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery; Draft Action Plan for Addressing Unmet Needs of Tropical Storm Debby

The Department of Community and Economic Development (Department) has created a draft action plan for using Federal funds to address the damage caused by Tropical Storm Debby. The Department is asking for public review and comment on this plan.

Background on Funding

On September 11, 2024, President Joseph Biden declared a major disaster because of Tropical Storm Debby, which occurred on August 9 and 10, 2024. As a result, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has provided funding through Pub.L. No. 118-158. The purpose of this funding is to support disaster relief, long-term recovery, infrastructure and housing restoration, economic revitalization and mitigation efforts in the areas most affected by the storm. The Commonwealth has been allocated \$14.620 million of Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery funds. Of this amount, at least \$11.696 million must be spent in the area HUD has identified as the “most impacted and distressed”: Tioga County.

About the Draft Action Plan

This plan details how this Commonwealth will use these funds. It includes specific criteria for project eligibility and outlines how the money will be used to support long-term recovery, restore infrastructure and housing and revitalize the local economy.

APPLICATIONS FOR NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMITS AND WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT (WQM) PERMITS UNDER THE CLEAN STREAMS LAW AND FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT

This notice provides information about persons who have applied to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for a new, renewed, or amended NPDES or WQM permit, or a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges, or have submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a General Permit. The applications and NOIs concern, but are not limited to, effluent discharges from sewage treatment facilities and industrial facilities to surface waters or groundwater; stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity (industrial stormwater), construction activity (construction stormwater), and municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s); the application of pesticides; the operation of Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs); and the construction of sewage, industrial waste, and manure storage, collection and treatment facilities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376). More information on the types of NPDES and WQM permits that are available can be found on DEP's website (visit www.dep.pa.gov and select Businesses, Water, Bureau of Clean Water, Wastewater Management, and NPDES and WQM Permitting Programs).

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. The RACT III Alternate Proposal will be issued as a significant modification to the facility's Title V operating permit 20-00145. The RACT III Alternate Proposal incorporates restrictions for the control of Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x). VFG is not a Major source of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC). These restrictions are intended to address the Commonwealth's RACT obligations under section 184 of the Clean Air Act for the 1997, 2008, and 2015 8-hour ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). The RACT III Alternate Proposal does not adopt any new regulations. This RACT III Alternate Proposal will be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval as a revision to the Commonwealth's State Implementation Plan (SIP) and will remain in effect until replaced pursuant to

40 CFR 51 and approval by the EPA. Requirements that are not part of the RACT III Alternate Proposal will be excluded from the SIP revision submittal.

During any Non-Operating Days, the NO_x emissions for each glass furnace averaged over consecutive non-operating days may not exceed the amount calculated using the following equation:

NO_x emission limit (pounds per day) = 7.0 (pounds per ton glass produced) × Furnace production capacity (tons of glass produced per day)

Recordkeeping: Continuous Emissions Monitoring Systems (CEMS) data and calculations to demonstrate compliance with NO_x emissions limits shall be retained by the permittee for a period of five (5) years and made available to the DEP upon request. Data or information required to determine compliance with the NO_x emissions limits shall be recorded and maintained in a time frame consistent with the averaging period of the NO_x limits.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. Copies of the appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure may be obtained from the Board. The appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure are also available in Braille or on audiotape from the Secretary of the Board at 717-787-3483. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create a right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decision law.

For individuals who wish to challenge actions, appeals must reach the Board within 30-days. A lawyer is not needed to file an appeal with the Board.

The stream mitigation project consisting of gate cuts at a designed excavated slope to eliminate the stream pooling to the pre-mining flow conditions. In conjunction with this approval, the Department is granting 401 Water Quality Certification certifying that the approved activities will comply with the applicable provision of sections 301—303, 306, and 307 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C.A. & 1341) and will not violate applicable Federal and State water quality standards. Covered Device Prohibited from Sale under Sections 302 and 507 of the Covered Device Recycling Act, Act 108 of 2010.

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) hereby announces that a certain manufacturer of covered devices is not included on the Department's list of registered manufacturers, maintained by the Department under sections 302 and 507 of the Covered Device Recycling Act (CDRA). Accordingly, under Section 302 of the CDRA, no retailer may offer these manufacturers' products for sale within the Commonwealth.

Manufacturers of new covered devices—such as televisions, laptop and desktop computers, tablets, etc.—offered for sale in Pennsylvania are required to register with the Department prior to commencing sales per Section 304 of the CDRA. Manufacturers must also pay an annual registration fee and submit a recycling plan and annual report. Section 302 of the CDRA prohibits the sale of covered devices in the Commonwealth by unregistered manufacturers.

The Department is required to maintain a list of registered manufacturers per Section 302(b) of the CDRA. The list can be accessed by visiting dep.pa.gov.

The following manufacturer is not included on the Department's list and are therefore considered out of compliance:

Fusion5

Due to its non-compliant status and non-inclusion on the list of registered manufacturers, the Department is notifying the public, in cooperation with covered device retailers, that the CDRA prohibits the sale of devices manufactured by Fusion5 within the Commonwealth, and that the sale of such devices would constitute unlawful conduct under the CDRA. Non-compliant manufacturers may once again be included on the Department's list of registered manufacturers, and their devices offered for sale in the Commonwealth, if the manufacturers return to compliance with all the applicable provisions of the CDRA.

Federal Consistency under the Coastal Zone Management Act; United States Army Corps of Engineers 2026 Nationwide Permit Reissuance

This notice is published under section 306(d)(14) of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (CZMA) (16 U.S.C. § 1455(d)(14)), regarding public participation in consistency determinations. The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) Coastal Resources Management Program has received notice that the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Baltimore District (applicant) is proposing to reissue and modify the Nationwide Permits (NWP) (90 FR 26100 (June 18, 2025)).

NWPs authorize certain activities under section 404 of the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. § 1344) and section 10 of the Federal Rivers and Harbors Appropriation Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C. § 403). The USACE is proposing to reissue 56 of the 57 existing NWPs and associated general conditions and definitions, with some modifications, and one new NWP. USACE is proposing to revise the text of NWP 12 (Oil or Natural Gas Pipeline Activities), NWP 13 (Bank Stabilization), NWP 15 (United States Coast Guard Approved Bridges), NWP 23 (Approved Categorical Exclusions), NWP 24 (Indian Tribe or State Administered Section 404 Programs), NWP 27 (Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration, Establishment and Enhancement Activities), NWP 48 (Commercial Shellfish Mariculture Activities), NWP 52 (Water-Based Renewable Energy Generation Projects), NWP 54 (Living Shorelines), NWP 55 (Seaweed Mariculture Activities), NWP 57 (Electric Utility Line and Telecommunications Activities) and NWP 58 (Utility Line Activities for Water and Other

Substances) to provide NWP authorization for additional activities or clarify what is authorized by these NWPs. Some of the proposed modifications to the NWPs are intended to address litigation that occurred after the 2021 NWPs were issued and went into effect. USACE is also proposing to modify some general conditions and definitions so that they are clearer and can be more easily understood by the regulated public, government personnel and interested parties, while retaining terms and conditions that help protect the aquatic environment and recognize when activities requiring USACE authorization would benefit the aquatic environment. Making the text of the NWPs clearer and easier to understand will also facilitate compliance with these permits, which will benefit the aquatic environment.

USACE is proposing to issue one new NWP, NWP A (Activities to Improve Passage of Fish and Other Aquatic Organisms). This new NWP is being proposed to provide NWP authorization for discharges of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States or structures or work in navigable waters for activities that improve the passage of fish and other aquatic organisms, including nature-based solutions such as nature-like fishways that provide a path for fish and other aquatic organisms to move past dams and weirs, but do not qualify for authorization under NWP 27 because they involve engineering features that do not resemble ecological references.

USACE is not proposing to reissue NWP 56, which authorizes structures in marine and estuarine waters, including Federal waters over the outer continental shelf, for finfish mariculture activities.

The applicant also proposes to suspend the following NWPs in this Commonwealth, except in areas within USACE Pittsburgh District's area of responsibility and areas channelward of the ordinary high water mark on nontidal waters or the high tide line on tidal waters, or both, on the Delaware River and the Schuylkill River downstream of the Fairmont Dam in Philadelphia: NWP 1 (Aids to Navigation), NWP 4 (Fish and Wildlife Harvesting) Enhancement and Attraction Devices and Activities, NWP 5 (Scientific Measurement Devices), NWP 7 (Outfall Structures and Associated Intake Structures), NWP 10 (Mooring Buoys), NWP 11 (Temporary Recreational Structures), NWP 12 (Oil or Natural Gas Pipeline Activities), NWP 13 (Bank Stabilization), NWP 14 (Linear Transportation Projects), NWP 15 (United States Coast Guard Approved Bridges), NWP 18 (Minor Discharges), NWP 19 (Minor Dredging), NWP 20 (Response Operations for Oil and Hazardous Substances), NWP 25 (Structural Discharges), NWP 26 [Reserved], NWP 29 (Residential Developments), NWP 33 (Temporary Construction, Access, and Dewatering), NWP 34 (Cranberry Production Activities), NWP 36 (Boat Ramps), NWP 37 (Emergency Watershed Protection and Rehabilitation), NWP 39 (Commercial and Institutional Developments), NWP 40 (Agricultural Activities), NWP 41 (Reshaping Existing Drainage and Irrigation Ditches), NWP 42 (Recreational Facilities), NWP 43 (Stormwater Management Facilities), NWP 45 (Repair of Uplands Damaged by Discrete Events), NWP 46 (Discharges in Ditches), NWP 47 [Reserved], NWP 51 (Land-Based Renewable Energy Generation Facilities), NWP 53 (Removal of Low-Head Dams), NWP 54 (Living shorelines), NWP 57 (Electric Utility Line and Telecommunications Activities), NWP 58 (Utility Line Activities for Water and Other Substances) and NWP 59 (Water Reclamation and Reuse Facilities).

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name*: The name of the Progressive Top Prize Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania Cash Kingdom ("Cash Kingdom"). The game number is PA-5294.

2. Definitions:

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer*: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code*: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *Game Ticket*: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(d) *Lottery Central Computer System*: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(e) *Lottery Terminal*: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(f) *PATH*: The area on the left of a Cash Kingdom ticket containing three play symbols. The player wins the current "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount when a Dragon (DRAGON) symbol, a Shield (SHIELD) symbol and a Sword (SWORD) symbol all appear in the "PATH" area.

(g) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(h) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(j) *PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE*: The top prize available for this game that begins with a minimum prize amount that grows at a pre-determined rate every time a ticket is purchased, and then resets to the minimum prize amount whenever a top prize-winning ticket is sold.

(k) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(l) *SLAY THE DAY*: A feature of the Cash Kingdom game consisting of a "PATH" area and three "SLAY THE DAY" play symbols. The player wins the current "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount when a Dragon (DRAGON) symbol, a Shield (SHIELD) symbol and a Sword (SWORD) symbol all appear in the "PATH" area. "SLAY THE DAY" is played separately.

(m) *WINNING NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.

(n) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(o) *YOUR NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area.

3. *Price*: The price of a Cash Kingdom ticket is \$30.

4. *Description of the Cash Kingdom Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The Cash Kingdom lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. With the exception of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE," all prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Cash Kingdom tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) Cash Kingdom is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player correctly matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. The player wins a prize of \$500 when a Gemstone (WIN500) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area. When a Crown (4TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area the player wins four times the prize amount shown under that Crown (4TIMES) symbol. When a Cash (CASH) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area the player wins the prize amount shown under that Cash (CASH) symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) Cash Kingdom also contains a "SLAY THE DAY" feature consisting of a "PATH" area and three "SLAY THE DAY" play symbols. The player wins the current "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount when a Dragon (DRAGON) symbol, a Shield (SHIELD) symbol and a Sword (SWORD) symbol all appear in the "PATH" area. "SLAY THE DAY" is played separately.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) Cash Kingdom tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Cash Kingdom ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Cash Kingdom ticket and select the Cash Kingdom option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. *Cash Kingdom ticket characteristics*:

(a) Cash Kingdom tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols*: Cash Kingdom tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a "SLAY THE DAY" feature containing a "PATH" area and three "SLAY THE DAY" play symbols.

When a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winning ticket is sold, the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" resets to \$500,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 7 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 20 times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game*: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Cash Kingdom lottery game.

6. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners*:

(a) All Cash Kingdom prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which a Dragon (DRAGON) symbol, a Shield (SHIELD) symbol and a Sword (SWORD) symbol all appear in the "PATH" area of the "SLAY THE DAY" feature, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE." The amount won under this paragraph is the amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE," determined by the Lottery Central Computer System, as of the time the winning ticket was purchased. The amount won will be a minimum of \$500,000.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30^{.00} (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which a Cash (CASH) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a

prize symbol of \$30^{.00} (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under that Cash (CASH) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

7. *Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning:* The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

SLAY THE DAY: Find ALL THREE symbols in the PATH area to win the current PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE amount instantly! SLAY THE DAY is played separately.

Prizes, including top prizes, are subject to availability at the time of purchase.

8. Ticket responsibility:

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

9. Ticket validation and requirements:

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

10. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

11. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

12. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

13. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

14. *"PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" restrictions:*

(a) An amount of \$2⁰⁰ from the sale of each Cash Kingdom ticket will be accumulated in the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" pool.

(b) *Prize Amount:* The amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" at the time a ticket is purchased can only be

verified through the Lottery's Central Computer System. Any advertisement or any materials describing the amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" are only valid as of the time they are posted. If any discrepancy exists between this notice and any material describing or advertising the Cash Kingdom game, this notice and the data contained in the Lottery's Central Computer System shall govern.

(c) The "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" and all other prizes are subject to availability at the time of purchase. The Lottery is not responsible for prizes that are not awarded due to technical issues. In the event of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" being reset without the actual sale of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winning ticket, all prize money that had accumulated into the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" pool (i.e., \$2⁰⁰ from the sale of each ticket) shall be awarded as part of the next "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" won.

(d) Prizes payable to "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winners will be paid as a one-time cash payment. For the purposes of calculation of the prize to be paid to "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winners, the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount will be rounded up to the nearest \$0.50.

15. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Cash Kingdom lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

16. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

17. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Cash Kingdom lottery game tickets.

18. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled

only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

19. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Cash Kingdom or through normal communications methods.

20. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the Cash Kingdom lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Lucky 13 Fast Play Game 5296

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania Lucky 13 (“Lucky 13”). The game number is PA-5296.

2. *Definitions:*

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer:* A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code:* The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *Game Ticket:* A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player’s record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(d) *Lottery Central Computer System:* The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(e) *Lottery Terminal:* A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(f) *LUCKY 13 BONUS:* The area at the bottom of a Lucky 13 ticket including four spots, each containing one play symbol. The player wins a prize of \$13 when a LUCKY (WIN13) symbol appears in the “LUCKY 13 BONUS” area. “LUCKY 13 BONUS” is played separately.

(g) *Play:* A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(h) *Play Area:* The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(i) *Play Symbol:* A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(j) *Prize:* A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(k) *WINNING NUMBERS:* The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area.

(l) *Winning ticket:* A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(m) *YOUR NUMBERS:* The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area.

3. *Price:* The price of a Lucky 13 ticket is \$2.

4. *Description of the Lucky 13 Fast Play lottery game:*

(a) The Lucky 13 lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Lucky 13 tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) Lucky 13 is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area to any of the play symbols located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol. When a 13 (THRTN) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area the player wins the prize shown under that 13 (THRTN) symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) Lucky 13 also contains a “LUCKY 13 BONUS” area including four spots, each containing one play symbol. The player wins a prize of \$13 when a LUCKY (WIN13) symbol appears in the “LUCKY 13 BONUS” area. “LUCKY 13 BONUS” is played separately.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) Lucky 13 tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Lucky 13 ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Lucky 13 ticket and select the Lucky 13 option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. *Lucky 13 ticket characteristics:*

(a) Lucky 13 tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols:* Lucky 13 tickets will contain one play area, consisting of a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "LUCKY 13 BONUS" area. The "LUCKY 13 BONUS" is played separately. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN) and 20 (TWENT). The play symbols are their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT) and a 13 (THRTN) symbol. The play symbols and their captions located in the "LUCKY 13 BONUS" area are: Skull (NOBONUS) symbol, Pumpkin (NOBONUS) symbol, Ghost (NOBONUS) symbol, Black Cat (NOBONUS) symbol, Cauldron (NOBONUS) symbol, Bats (NOBONUS) symbol, Spiderweb (NOBONUS) symbol, Broomstick (NOBONUS) symbol and a LUCKY (WIN13) symbol.

(c) *Prize Symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL), \$3.⁰⁰ (THR DOL), \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$13.⁰⁰ (THIRTEEN), \$30.⁰⁰ (THIRTY), \$50.⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$130 (ONEHUNTHY) and \$3,000 (THR THO).

(d) *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$2, \$3, \$5, \$10, \$13, \$30, \$50, \$130 and \$3,000. The prize that can be won in the "LUCKY 13 BONUS" is \$13. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 10 times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game:* Approximately 720,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Lucky 13 lottery game.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery ("Lottery") will conduct a Spooky Good Second-Chance Drawing ("Drawing") for which non-winning Lucky 13 lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).

7. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:*

(a) All Lucky 13 prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$3,000 (THR THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$130 (ONEHUNTHY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$130.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.⁰⁰

(FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a 13 (THRTN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$30.⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under that 13 (THRTN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$13.⁰⁰ (THIRTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which a 13 (THRTN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$13.⁰⁰ (THIRTEEN) appears in the Prize area under that 13 (THRTN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which a LUCKY (WIN13) symbol appears in the "LUCKY 13 BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which a 13 (THRTN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under that 13 (THRTN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which a 13 (THRTN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under that 13 (THRTN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$3.⁰⁰ (THR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which a 13 (THRTN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$3.⁰⁰ (THR DOL) appears in the Prize area under that 13 (THRTN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which a 13 (THRTN) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize

symbol of \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under that 13 (THRTN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

8. *Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning:* The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

9. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery's Spooky Good Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying Fast Play and instant lottery game tickets:

(a) *Qualifying Tickets:* Non-winning PA-5295 Money on the Brain (\$5), PA-5296 Lucky 13 (\$2), PA-5297 Rest in Prizes (\$1) Fast Play lottery game tickets, and PA-1754 Mini Monsters \$100 Blowout (\$2) instant lottery game tickets ("Qualifying Tickets") are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit <https://www.PAiLottery.com>. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at <https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/>, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete, and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(1) The Lottery will conduct one Spooky Good Second-Chance Drawing from among all Fast Play and instant lottery game Qualifying Tickets entered into the Drawing. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) The entry period for Fast Play lottery game Qualifying Tickets will begin after 4:59:59 a.m. September 2, 2025, and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. November 6, 2025. The entry period for instant lottery game Qualifying Tickets will begin after 11:59:59 p.m. September 21, 2025, and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. November 6, 2025. All entries received during the entry periods will be entered in the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between November 7, 2025, and November 21, 2025.

(3) The entry periods for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at <https://www.palottery.com>.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corre-

sponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5295 Money on the Brain (\$5) = five entries; PA-5296 Lucky 13 (\$2) = two entries; PA-5297 Rest in Prizes (\$1) = 1 entry; and PA-1754 Mini Monsters \$100 Blowout (\$2) = two entries.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry periods as described in section 9(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$31,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$13,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The fifth through the ninth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(iv) The tenth through the fifty-ninth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and

Lottery procedure. Entries not received for any other reason will not be considered entries.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC, Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms & conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five-times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

10. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

11. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

12. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation play ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

13. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

14. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Lucky 13 lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

17. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

18. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Lucky 13 lottery game tickets.

19. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in

a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

20. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Lucky 13 or through normal communications methods.

21. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the Lucky 13 lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Money on the Brain Fast Play Game 5295

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania Money on the Brain (“Money on the Brain”). The game number is PA-5295.

2. *Definitions:*

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer:* A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code:* The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *BRAIN:* A feature of the Money on the Brain game where the player multiplies the prize amount below the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol by 5 and wins that amount when any “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol is printed with a “BRAIN” symbol.

(d) *EYES ON THE PRIZE:* The area at the bottom of a Money on the Brain ticket containing one prize symbol. The player wins the prize shown in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area when seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area. “EYES ON THE PRIZE” is played separately.

(e) *Game Ticket:* A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player’s record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(f) *Lottery Central Computer System:* The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(g) *Lottery Terminal:* A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(h) *Play:* A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(i) *Play Area:* The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(j) *Play Symbol:* A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(k) *Prize:* A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(l) *WINNING NUMBERS:* The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area.

(m) *Winning ticket:* A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(n) *YOUR NUMBERS:* The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area.

3. *Price:* The price of a Money on the Brain ticket is \$5.

4. *Description of the Money on the Brain Fast Play lottery game:*

(a) The Money on the Brain lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Money on the Brain tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) Money on the Brain is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area to any of the play symbols located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol. When a “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol is printed with a “BRAIN” symbol, the player multiplies the prize shown under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol by 5 and wins that amount. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) Money on the Brain is also played by finding seven Eyeball symbols in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area. A player finding seven Eyeball symbols in the “YOUR NUMBERS”

area will win the prize shown in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area. “EYES ON THE PRIZE” is played separately.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) Money on the Brain tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Money on the Brain ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Money on the Brain ticket and select the Money on the Brain option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. Money on the Brain ticket characteristics:

(a) Money on the Brain tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols:* Money on the Brain tickets will contain a “WINNING NUMBERS” area, a “YOUR NUMBERS” area and an “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area. The play symbols and their captions located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area and the “YOUR NUMBERS” area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and printed with a “BRAIN” symbol are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The “EYES ON THE PRIZE” play symbol located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area is an Eyeball symbol.

(c) *Prize Symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area are: \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$15.⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN), \$25.⁰⁰ (TWY FIV), \$50.⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$75.⁰⁰ (SVY FIV), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$250 (TWOHUNFTY), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$13,000 (THRTNTHO). The prize symbols and their captions located in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area are: \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$15.⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN), \$25.⁰⁰ (TWY FIV), \$50.⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$75.⁰⁰ (SVY FIV), \$100 (ONE HUN) and \$250 (TWOHUNFTY).

(d) *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$15, \$25, \$50, \$75, \$100, \$250, \$1,000 and \$13,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 12 times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game:* Approximately 480,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Money on the Brain lottery game.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery (“Lottery”) will conduct a Spooky Good Second-Chance Drawing (“Drawing”) for which non-winning Money on the Brain lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).

7. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:*

(a) All Money on the Brain prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$13,000 (THRTNTHO) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$75.⁰⁰ (SVY FIV) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol is printed on a “BRAIN” symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$375.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$250 (TWOHUNFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol is printed on a “BRAIN” symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$250 (TWOHUNFTY) appears in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25.⁰⁰ (TWY FIV) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol is printed on a “BRAIN” symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$125.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize

symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$75⁰⁰ (SVY FIV) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$75.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol is printed on a “BRAIN” symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$75.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$75⁰⁰ (SVY FIV) appears in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$75.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol is printed on a “BRAIN” symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25⁰⁰ (TWY FIV) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING

NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol is printed on a “BRAIN” symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$25⁰⁰ (TWY FIV) appears in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which seven Eyeball symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the “EYES ON THE PRIZE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit <https://www.PAiLottery.com>. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at <https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/>, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying

Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete, and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description:*

The entry period for instant lottery game Qualifying Tickets will begin after 11:59:59 p.m. September 21, 2025, and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. November 6, 2025. All entries received during the entry periods will be entered in the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between November 7, 2025, and November 21, 2025.

(3) The entry periods for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at <https://www.palottery.com>.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5295 Money on the Brain (\$5) = five entries; PA-5296 Lucky 13 (\$2) = two entries; PA-5297 Rest in Prizes (\$1) = one entry; and PA-1754 Mini Monsters \$100 Blowout (\$2) = two entries.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry periods as described in section 9(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$31,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants

who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$13,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The fifth through the ninth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(iv) The tenth through the fifty-ninth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure. Entries not received for any other reason will not be considered entries.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC, Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms & conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five-times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

10. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

11. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

12. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

13. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

14. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the

sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Money on the Brain lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

17. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

18. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Money on the Brain lottery game tickets.

19. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

20. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be

disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Money on the Brain or through normal communications methods.

21. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the Money on the Brain lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Rest in Prizes Fast Play Game 5297

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania Rest in Prizes ("Rest in Prizes"). The game number is PA-5297.

2. *Definitions:*

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer:* A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code:* The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *Game Ticket:* A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(d) *GRAVEYARD GREEN:* A feature of the Rest in Prizes game where the player adds \$3 to the prize shown below a matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol and wins that amount when any "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed with a Stack of Cash symbol.

(e) *Lottery Central Computer System:* The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(f) *Lottery Terminal:* A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(g) *Play:* A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(h) *Play Area:* The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(i) *Play Symbol:* A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(j) *Prize:* A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(k) *WINNING NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.

(l) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(m) *YOUR NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area.

3. *Price*: The price of a Rest in Prizes ticket is \$1.

4. *Description of the Rest in Prizes Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The Rest in Prizes lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Rest in Prizes tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) Rest in Prizes is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. When a "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed with a Stack of Cash symbol, the player adds \$3 to the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol and wins that amount. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(d) Rest in Prizes tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(e) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Rest in Prizes ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(f) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Rest in Prizes ticket and select the Rest in Prizes option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. *Rest in Prizes ticket characteristics*:

(a) Rest in Prizes tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols*: Rest in Prizes tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "GRAVEYARD GREEN" feature. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN) and 20 (TWENT). The play symbols and their captions located in

the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and printed with a Stack of Cash symbol are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN) and 20 (TWENT).

(c) *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: FREE (TICKET), \$1⁰⁰ (ONE DOL), \$2⁰⁰ (TWO DOL), \$3⁰⁰ (THR DOL), \$4⁰⁰ (FOR DOL), \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$13⁰⁰ (THIRTEEN), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN) and \$1,300 (THRTNHUN).

(d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: Free \$1 Ticket, \$1, \$2, \$3, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$13, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100 and \$1,300. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to nine times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game*: Approximately 960,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Rest in Prizes lottery game.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing*: The Pennsylvania Lottery ("Lottery") will conduct a Spooky Good Second-Chance Drawing ("Drawing") for which non-winning Rest in Prizes lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).

7. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners*:

(a) All Rest in Prizes prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,300 (THRTNHUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,300.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed with a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$53.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$33.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$23.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$13.⁰⁰ (THIRTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$16.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$13.⁰⁰ (THIRTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$8.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.⁰⁰ (FOR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$7.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$3.⁰⁰ (THR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.⁰⁰ (FOR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1.⁰⁰ (ONE DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol is printed on a Stack of Cash symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$3.⁰⁰ (THR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1.⁰⁰ (ONE DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Rest in Prizes Fast Play Game Ticket.

8. *Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning:* The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. (3) The entry periods for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at <https://www.palottery.com>.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5295 Money on the Brain (\$5) = five entries; PA-5296 Lucky 13 (\$2) = two entries; PA-5297 Rest in Prizes (\$1) = 1 entry; and PA-1754 Mini Monsters \$100 Blowout (\$2) = two entries.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC, Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

10. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

11. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

12. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

13. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

14. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the

sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Rest in Prizes lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

17. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

18. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Rest in Prizes lottery game tickets.

19. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

20. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be

disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Rest in Prizes or through normal communications methods.

21. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the Rest in Prizes lottery game announced in this notice.

Opinion And Order

By the Commission:

Before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) for consideration and disposition is a pro-

posed Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement (Joint Petition or Settlement) filed on June 6, 2025, by the Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (I&E) and Kaib and Kaib, LLC (Kaib and Kaib or the Company)¹ (collectively, the Parties), in respect to an informal investigation conducted by I&E regarding alleged failure of the Company to adhere to its tariff rate for customer service charges. The investigation was initiated in response to allegations that during the period from August 2019 through May 2024, Kaib and Kaib billed its customers a monthly customer service charge of \$7.50, instead of its tariff rate of \$5.50. Settlement at 5, 6.

I&E submitted a statement in support of the Settlement.² Therein, I&E submits that the terms of the proposed Settlement represents a fair and reasonable compromise between the Parties. I&E also submits that had this matter proceeded to litigation, Kaib and Kaib would have disputed the allegations in the Complaint and I&E would have been required to expend staff time and resources to prepare for and participate in the hearing. Additionally, I&E asserts that aside from avoiding litigation, the Settlement is in the public interest because the agreed-upon civil penalty is sufficient to ensure that Kaib and Kaib's future compliance with Section 1303 of the Public Utility Code (Code) requiring that only the tariffed rate be charged to customers. I&E Statement in Support at 8.

Finally, both Parties submit that the proposed Settlement Agreement is in the public interest and is consistent with our Policy Statement at 52 Pa. Code § 69.1201, Factors and standards for evaluating litigated and settled proceedings involving violations of the Public Utility Code and Commission regulations—statement of policy (Policy Statement). Before issuing a final decision on the merits of the proposed Settlement, and consistent with the requirement of 52 Pa. Code § 3.113(b)(3), we shall publish the Settlement in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and provide an opportunity for interested parties to file comments regarding the proposed Settlement.³

I. History of the Proceeding

On October 6, 2023, Kaib and Kaib filed Original Tariff Gas-Pa. P.U.C. No. 1 with the Commission, at Docket No. R-2023-3043594, proposing an annual increase in revenues of \$28,337 (or approximately 65%) (Original Proposed Increase), to become effective December 4, 2023. Settlement at 4.

On November 16, 2023, Kaib and Kaib filed Original Tariff Gas-Pa. P.U.C. No. 2, replacing in its entirety Original Tariff Gas-Pa. P.U.C. No. 1, and delaying the effective date to December 22, 2023. On December 15, 2023, Kaib and Kaib filed Supplement No. 1 to Tariff Gas Pa. P.U.C. No. 2 (Tariff Revision), voluntarily postponing the effective date to March 15, 2024. On January 10, 2024, Kaib and Kaib revised its requested annual revenue increase to \$29,488 (or approximately 69.7%) (Revised Proposed Increase). Settlement at 4.

On February 1, 2024, a formal complaint was filed by a customer against Kaib and Kaib's Tariff Revision. By an Order entered March 14, 2024, the Commission suspended the filing until October 15, 2024, and assigned the

Tariff Revision to the Office of Administrative Law Judge (OALJ) to investigate the lawfulness, justness, and reasonableness of the proposed rate increases in the tariff filing. Settlement at 4.

On March 26, 2024, a second formal complaint was filed. On March 22, 2024, and April 23, 2024, respectively, the formal complaints were closed, for which Kaib and Kaib filed Certificate of Satisfaction. Settlement at 5.

On May 7, 2024, the Commission reassigned Kaib and Kaib's rate filing to the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services for further review and investigation. On June 13, 2024, the Commission issued an order in which it granted Kaib and Kaib's Tariff Revision (June 2024 Order). In the June 2024 Order, the Commission highlighted, that although the total annual requested revenue did not change, the amount of annual revenue increase that would be needed to meet the total requested annual revenue increased from \$28,337 under the Company's Original Proposed Increase to \$29,488 under its Revised Proposed Increase. The Commission further noted that while the Original Proposed Increase appeared to reflect a \$7.50 customer service charge, the Company's Revised Proposed Increase appeared to reflect the \$5.50 customer service charge permitted by Kaib and Kaib's tariff that was in effect at that time. Because of this discrepancy, the Commission referred the Kaib and Kaib's Tariff Revision to I&E for appropriate action. Settlement at 5.

On August 15, 2024, I&E sent Data Request—Set 1, consisting of three data requests. Therein, I&E inquired, inter alia, whether Kaib and Kaib had charged any customer a monthly customer service charge of \$7.50, as opposed to the monthly customer service charge of \$5.50 that was outlined in the Company's then current tariff. Settlement at 6.

On September 20, 2024, Kaib and Kaib responded to I&E's Data Request. Included in Kaib and Kaib's response was an exhibit consisting of twelve (12) months of monthly gas bills for one residential customer and one commercial customer. For both the residential customer and the commercial customer, a handwritten figure of "\$7.50" was provided in each monthly bill next to the line item "service charge," which was in typeface. Kaib and Kaib stated that it had charged its customers a monthly customer service charge of \$7.50 beginning August 2019, while its then current tariff reflected a monthly customer service charge of \$5.50 for both residential services and commercial services. Settlement at 6.

Based on Kaib and Kaib's response to I&E's data request, I&E determined that the Company failed to adhere to its tariff rate for the customer service charge by billing its customers at a rate of \$7.50 per month from August 2019 to May 2024, as opposed to the rate of \$5.50 per month that was outlined in the Company's then current Tariff. Settlement at 6-7.

Based upon its investigation, I&E determined that the customer service charge billed by Kaib and Kaib was an amount that was in excess of the legally permitted rate. Accordingly, I&E was prepared to contend, by the filing of a formal complaint that Kaib and Kaib's conduct was in violation of Section 1303 of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 1303. Settlement at 6-7.

Thereafter, the Parties entered into negotiations and agreed to resolve the matter in accordance with the Commission's policy to promote settlements at 52 Pa. Code § 5.231. Settlement at 8. The Parties filed the instant Settlement on June 6, 2025.

¹ Kaib and Kaib is a natural gas distribution company (NGDC) licensed by the Commission to operate within Jefferson County where it has pipelines, including all or portions of Hazen Borough and Warsaw Township in Pennsylvania.

II. *Alleged Violations*

As noted above, based on information obtained through its informal investigation and a review of the relevant Commission Regulations and statutes, I&E was prepared to contend by the filing of a formal complaint that Kaib and Kaib violated certain provisions of the Commission's Regulations by billing its customers at a rate of \$7.50 per month from August 2019 to May 2024, as opposed to the rate of \$5.50 per month that was outlined in the Company's then current tariff. Accordingly, had this matter been litigated, I&E would have proffered evidence that the Company's actions constitute a violation of Section 1303 of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 1303. On the other hand, had this matter been litigated, Kaib and Kaib would have denied the alleged violations, raised defenses and/or mitigating factors in support of its defense, and defended against the same at hearing. Settlement at 6-7.

Additionally, the Parties assert that the Company understands the nature of the allegations that I&E would have asserted in a formal complaint. The Parties add that Kaib and Kaib's unlawful customer service charge of \$7.50 became moot in June 2024 when the Commission permitted Kaib and Kaib to increase its customer service charge to \$8.10 for residential customers and \$17.30 for commercial customers. The Parties represent that Kaib and Kaib understands that, going forward, any future changes to its rates must be approved by the Commission. Settlement at 7.

III. *Terms of the Settlement*

The Parties state that the purpose of the Settlement is to terminate I&E's informal investigation and settle this matter completely without litigation. Both Parties jointly acknowledge that approval of the Settlement Agreement is in the public interest and is fully consistent with the Commission's Policy Statement. Moreover, the Parties agree that the Settlement Agreement is in the public interest because it effectively addresses I&E's allegations that are the subject of I&E's informal investigation, it avoids the inherent unpredictability of the outcome of a contested proceeding, and it emphasizes the importance of compliance with the Commission's regulations by imposing a civil penalty. Settlement at 8, 10.

Pursuant to the proposed Settlement, Kaib and Kaib will refund to its customers a total of \$4,066.16, by way of bill credit and pay a civil penalty of \$500, within thirty days of the Commission's final order approving the Settlement, to resolve all allegations of charges in excess of the legally permitted rate and to fully and finally settle all possible liability and claims of alleged violation of the Commission's Regulations arising from, or related to, charges in excess of the legally permitted rate. Settlement at 8-9. The essential terms of the Settlement are set forth in Paragraph No. 40 of the Joint Petition, which is recited in full, below, as it appears in the Joint Petition:

40. I&E and Kaib and Kaib, intending to be legally bound and for consideration given, desire to fully and finally conclude this informal investigation and agree to stipulate as to the following terms solely for the purposes of this Settlement Agreement. Of its 47 customers:

A. Kaib and Kaib shall refund those 45 customers who have had accounts with Kaib and Kaib since August 2019 or before the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 42 months, plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$4,006.80.

B. Kaib and Kaib shall refund each of its 45 customers by providing each such customer with a monthly

bill credit of \$9.90, starting with the first full month after the entry of the Commission's Final Order, and continuing for eight months, with the ninth and final month's bill credit being \$9.84.

C. Kaib and Kaib shall refund the customer who had an account since February 2023 (identified as Meter 50 in the Response to I&E's Data Request—Set I) the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 16 months (encompassing the period of February 2023 to May 2024), plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$33.92. The Meter 50 customer shall receive a bill credit of \$9.90 with the bill for the first full month after the entry of the Commission's Final Order, and continuing for a total of three months, with the remainder of \$4.22 due as a bill credit in the fourth month's bill.

D. Kaib and Kaib shall refund the customer who had an account since May 2023 (identified as Meter 51 in the Response to I&E's Data Request—Set I) the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 12 months (encompassing the period of May 2023 to May 2024), plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$25.44. The Meter 51 customer shall receive a bill credit of \$9.90 with the bill for the first full month after the entry of the Commission's Final Order, and continuing for a total of two months, with the remainder of \$5.63 due as a bill credit in the third month's bill.

E. Should there be any customers to whom a refund is due and owing and who are no longer Kaib and Kaib customers at the time of the entry of the Commission's Final Order, such customers shall be provided their refund by way of a lump sum payment should current contact information for those past customers be readily available.

F. The total amount to be refunded by Kaib and Kaib to its customers is \$4,066.16.

G. In addition to refunds, Kaib and Kaib shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500) within 30 days of a Final Commission Order approving the Settlement.

H. Kaib and Kaib shall file compliance tariff(s), on at least one-day's notice, as may be necessary to include the terms of this settlement in the company's tariff.

Settlement at 8-9.

In exchange for the actions taken by Kaib and Kaib, as described above, I&E agrees to forbear from initiating any formal complaint relating to failure to adhere to tariff rate that is the subject of the proposed Settlement. The Settlement Agreement is issued without prejudice to any position that any of the parties may have advanced and without prejudice to the position any of the parties may advance in the future on the merits of the issues in future proceedings, except to the extent necessary to effectuate the terms and conditions of this Settlement Agreement. Settlement at 10-11.

The proposed Settlement is conditioned on the Commission's approval without modification of any of its terms or conditions. If the Commission modifies the proposed Settlement, either Party may elect to withdraw from the Settlement and may proceed with litigation and, in such event the settlement agreement shall be void and of no effect. Such election to withdraw must be made in writing, filed with the Secretary of the Commission and served upon all parties within twenty business days after entry of an Order modifying the Settlement. Settlement at 10-11.

IV. Discussion

Pursuant to our Regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 5.231, it is the Commission's policy to promote settlements. The Commission must, however, review proposed settlements to determine whether the terms are in the public interest. *Pa. PUC v. Philadelphia Gas Works*, Docket No. M-00031768 (Order entered January 7, 2004).

In reviewing settlements that resolve informal investigations, the Commission will provide other potentially affected parties with the opportunity to file comments regarding a proposed settlement prior to issuing a decision. The Commission's Regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 3.113(b) provide as follows:

§ 3.113. Resolution of informal investigations.

* * *

(b) Under 65 Pa.C.S. Chapter 7 (relating to Sunshine Act), the Commission's official actions resolving informal investigations will be as follows:

* * *

(3) When the utility, or other person subject to the Commission's jurisdiction, has committed to undertake action to address or remedy a violation or potential violation of the act or to resolve another perceived deficiency at the utility, in the form of a settlement with the Commission staff or other resolution of the matter, the Commission's consideration of the settlement or approval of the utility's action will occur at public meeting. Except for staff reports and other documents covered by a specific legal privilege, documents relied upon by the Commission in reaching its determination shall be made part of the public record. *Before the Commission makes a final decision to adopt the settlement or to approve the utility's action, the Commission will provide other potentially affected persons with the opportunity to submit exceptions thereon or to take other action provided for under law.*

52 Pa. Code § 3.113(b) (emphasis added). See also *Pa. PUC, Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement v. PPL Electric Utilities Corporation*, Docket No. M-2012-2264635 (Order entered September 13, 2012); *Pa. PUC, Bureau of*

Investigation and Enforcement v. Liberty Power Holdings, LLC, Docket No. M-2019-2568471 (Order entered August 8, 2019).

V. Conclusion

Before issuing a decision on the merits of the proposed Settlement, and consistent with the requirement of 52 Pa. Code § 3.113(b)(3), and for the reason(s) stated above, we believe it is appropriate to publish the Settlement in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Therefore, we will: (1) publish this Opinion and Order and a copy of the proposed Settlement, I&E's Statement in Support, and proposed Ordering Paragraphs, attached hereto, in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*; and, (2) provide an opportunity for interested parties to file comments regarding the proposed Settlement within twenty-five days after the date of publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*; Therefore,

It Is Ordered That:

1. The Secretary's Bureau shall duly certify this Opinion and Order along with the attached Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement and the Statements in Support thereof, at Docket No. M-2025-3049924, and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

2. Within twenty-five (25) days after the date that this Opinion and Order and the attached Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement and the Statement in Support thereof are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, interested parties may file comments concerning the proposed Settlement.

3. A copy of this Opinion and Order, together with the attached Settlement Agreement, Statement in Support thereof, and proposed Ordering Paragraphs, at Docket No. M-2025-3049924, shall be served on the Office of Consumer Advocate and the Office of Small Business Advocate.

4. Subsequent to the Commission's review of any comments filed in this proceeding, at Docket No. M-2025-3049924, a final Opinion and Order will be issued.

JOINT PETITION FOR APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT

TO THE HONORABLE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.41 and 5.232, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's ("Commission") Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement ("I&E") and Kaib and Kaib, LLC ("Kaib and Kaib" or "the Company") hereby submit this Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement ("Settlement" or "Settlement Agreement") to resolve all issues related to the above-docketed informal investigation.

As part of this Settlement Agreement, I&E and Kaib and Kaib, LLC (hereinafter referred to collectively as the

"Parties") respectfully request that the Commission enter a Final Opinion and Order approving the Settlement without modification. A Statement in Support of the Settlement expressing the views of I&E, which Kaib and Kaib joins, is attached hereto as Appendix A. Proposed Ordering Paragraphs are attached hereto as Appendix B.

I. Introduction

1. The Parties to this Settlement Agreement are the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement, by its prosecuting attorneys, with a principal address of Commonwealth Keystone Building, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120

and Kaib and Kaib, LLC with its principal place of business at P.O. Box 8034, Zanesville, OH 43702.

2. The Commission is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within this Commonwealth as well as other entities subject to its jurisdiction, pursuant to the Public Utility Code (the “Code”), 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 101, et seq.

3. I&E is the entity established to prosecute complaints against public utilities and other entities subject to the Commission’s jurisdiction pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 308.2(a)(11); See also Implementation of Act 129 of 2008; Organization of Bureaus and Offices, Docket No. M-2008-2071852 (Order entered August 11, 2011) (delegating authority to initiate proceedings that are prosecutory in nature to I&E).

4. Section 501(a) of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code (“Code”), 66 Pa.C.S. § 501(a), authorizes and obligates the Commission to execute and enforce the provisions of the Code.

5. Section 701 of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 701, authorizes the Commission, inter alia, to hear and determine complaints alleging a violation of any law or regulation that the Commission has jurisdiction to administer.

6. Section 3301 of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 3301, authorizes the Commission to impose civil penalties on any public utility or on any other person or corporation subject to the Commission’s authority for violations of the Code, the Commission’s regulations, or both. Section 3301 allows for the imposition of a fine for each violation and each day’s continuance of such violation(s). 66 Pa.C.S. § 3301.

7. Kaib and Kaib is a “public utility” as that term is defined at 66 Pa.C.S. § 102 as it is engaged in providing public utility service as a natural gas distribution company (“NGDC”) in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to the public for compensation.

8. Kaib and Kaib serves 44 jurisdictional residential customers and 3 jurisdictional commercial customers.

9. Although most of Kaib and Kaib’s customers are long-standing, two are recent, having been served by the utility since February 2023 and May 2023, respectively.

10. Kaib and Kaib, as a gas utility, is subject to the power and authority of the Commission pursuant to Section 501(c) of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 501(c), which requires a public utility to comply with Commission regulations and orders.

11. Pursuant to the provisions of the applicable Commonwealth statutes and regulations, the Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter and the actions of Kaib and Kaib in its capacity as a gas supplier.

12. Pursuant to Sections 331(a) and 506 of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 331(a) and 506 and Section 3.113 of the Commission’s regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 3.113, Commission staff has the authority to conduct informal investigations or informal proceedings in order to gather data and/or to substantiate allegations of potential violations of the Commission’s regulations.

II. Background

13. On October 6, 2023, Kaib and Kaib filed Original Tariff Gas-Pa. P.U.C. No. 1 with the Commission, Docket No. R-2023-3043594, proposing an annual increase in rates of \$28,337 (or approximately 65%) to become effective December 4, 2023.

14. On November 16, 2023, Kaib and Kaib filed Original Tariff Gas-Pa. P.U.C. No. 2, replacing in its entirety Original Tariff Gas-Pa. P.U.C. No. 1, and delaying the effective date to December 22, 2023.

15. On December 15, 2023, Kaib and Kaib filed Supplement No. 1 to Tariff Gas Pa. P.U.C. No. 2, voluntarily postponing the effective date to March 15, 2024.

16. On January 10, 2024, Kaib and Kaib revised its requested annual increase to \$29,488 (approximately 69.7%).

17. On February 1, 2024, a formal complaint was filed by a customer against Kaib and Kaib’s tariff filing.

18. By Commission Order entered March 14, 2024, and pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 1308(d), Tariff Gas-Pa. P.U.C. No. 2 was suspended by operation of law until October 15, 2024, unless Commission Order provides otherwise.

19. The March 14, 2024, Order also assigned the tariff filing to the Office of Administrative Law Judge to investigate the lawfulness, justness, and reasonableness of the proposed rate increases in the tariff filing.

20. On March 26, 2024, a second Kaib and Kaib customer filed a formal complaint.

21. On March 22, 2024, and April 23, 2024, the respective formal complaints filed by the two Kaib and Kaib customers were each closed by way of a Certificate of Satisfaction.

22. On May 7, 2024, an Order was issued reassigning the filing to the Commission’s Bureau of Technical Utility Services for further review and investigation.

23. On June 13, 2024, the Commission issued an order granting the tariff revision filed by Kaib and Kaib (“June Order”).

24. The Commission noted in its June Order that the January 10, 2024, revision filed by Kaib and Kaib, the total annual requested revenue did not change, but the amount of revenue increase that would be needed to meet the total requested annual revenue increased from \$28,337 to \$29,488.

25. The October 6, 2023, filing by Kaib and Kaib, requesting an increase of \$28,337 in revenue, appears to reflect a \$7.50 customer service charge.

26. The January 10, 2024, filing by Kaib and Kaib, adjusting the requested revenue increase to \$29,488, appears to reflect the \$5.50 customer service charge permitted by its tariff in effect at that time.

27. In its June Order, the Commission referred the matter of Kaib and Kaib’s customer service charge to the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement for appropriate action.

28. On August 15, 2024, I&E sent Kaib and Kaib its Data Request—Set I, consisting of three data requests.

29. On September 20, 2024, Kaib and Kaib provided its response to I&E’s Data Request—Set I.

30. Included in Kaib and Kaib’s response was an exhibit consisting of twelve (12) months of monthly gas bills for one residential customer and one commercial customer, as requested by I&E in its Data Request—Set I.

31. For both the residential customer and the commercial customer, a handwritten figure of “\$7.50” was provided in each monthly bill next to the line item “service charge,” which was in typeface.

32. Additionally, in response to a Data Request from I&E inquiring whether Kaib and Kaib had charged any customer a customer service charge of \$7.50, stated “[y]es, the Company increased the monthly customer service charge in August 2019, from the then current tariff rates of \$5.50 for residential service and \$5.50 for commercial service.”

III. Alleged Violations

33. Based on information obtained through its investigation, as described above, and a review of the Commission’s regulations and relevant regulations and statutes, I&E was prepared to contend by the filing of a formal complaint that Kaib and Kaib violated certain provisions of the Commission’s regulations, in that:

A. Kaib and Kaib failed to adhere to its tariff rate for the customer service charge by billing its customers \$7.50 per month from August 2019 to May 2024 when its tariff rate was \$5.50 per month. The customer service charge billed by Kaib and Kaib was an amount that was in excess of the legally permitted rate, in violation of 66 Pa.C.S. § 1303.

34. These allegations, if proven, constitute a violation of 66 Pa.C.S. § 1303 (providing “[n]o public utility shall, directly or indirectly, by any device whatsoever, or in anywise, demand or receive from any person, corporation, or municipal corporation a greater or less rate for any service rendered or to be rendered by such public utility than that specified in the tariffs of such public utility applicable thereto.”). See also *West Penn Power Co. v. Nationwide Mut. Ins. Co.*, 228 A.2d 218, 220 (Pa. Super 1967) (“A utility can only charge the customer the lawful rate as tariffed.”); *Bell Tel. Co. of Pennsylvania v. Pa. P.U.C.*, 417 A.2d 827, 828-829 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1980) (“[I]t is well established that in the absence of an exception by the Commission, a public utility may not charge any rate for services other than that lawfully tariffed, and contracts fixing rates are superseded by the rate in effect at the time the service is delivered.”).

35. Had the matter been litigated, Kaib and Kaib would have denied the alleged violations, raised defenses and/or mitigating factors in support of its defense, and defended against the same at hearing.

36. Kaib and Kaib understands the nature of the allegations that I&E would have asserted in a formal complaint. Kaib and Kaib’s unlawful customer service charge of \$7.50 became moot in June 2024 when the Commission permitted Kaib and Kaib to increase its customer service charge to \$8.10 for residential customers and \$17.30 for commercial customers. Kaib and Kaib understands that, going forward, any future changes to its rates must be approved by the Commission.

IV. Settlement Terms

37. Pursuant to the Commission’s policy of encouraging settlements that are reasonable and in the public interest,⁴ I&E and Kaib and Kaib held a series of discussions that culminated in this Settlement. The purpose of this Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement is to terminate I&E’s informal investigation and to settle this matter completely without litigation. There has been no Formal Complaint filed, no evidentiary hearing before any tribunal, and no sworn testimony taken in any proceeding related to this incident.

38. Kaib and Kaib fully acknowledges the seriousness of I&E’s allegations and recognizes the need to prevent

the reoccurrence of the misconduct which was the subject of I&E’s instant investigation.

39. The Parties recognize that their positions and claims are disputed and given that the precise outcome of a contested proceeding is uncertain, the Parties further recognize the benefits of amicably resolving the disputed issues through settlement.

40. I&E and Kaib and Kaib, intending to be legally bound and for consideration given, desire to fully and finally conclude this informal investigation and agree to stipulate as to the following terms solely for the purposes of this Settlement Agreement. Of its 47 customers:

A. Kaib and Kaib shall refund those 45 customers who have had accounts with Kaib and Kaib since August 2019 or before the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 42 months, plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$4,006.80.

B. Kaib and Kaib shall refund each of its 45 customers by providing each such customer with a monthly bill credit of \$9.90, starting with the first full month after the entry of the Commission’s Final Order, and continuing for eight months, with the ninth and final month’s bill credit being \$9.84.

C. Kaib and Kaib shall refund the customer who had an account since February 2023 (identified as Meter 50 in the Response to I&E’s Data Request—Set I) the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 16 months (encompassing the period of February 2023 to May 2024), plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$33.92. The Meter 50 customer shall receive a bill credit of \$9.90 with the bill for the first full month after the entry of the Commission’s Final Order, and continuing for a total of three months, with the remainder of \$4.22 due as a bill credit in the fourth month’s bill.

D. Kaib and Kaib shall refund the customer who had an account since May 2023 (identified as Meter 51 in the Response to I&E’s Data Request—Set I) the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 12 months (encompassing the period of May 2023 to May 2024), plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$25.44. The Meter 51 customer shall receive a bill credit of \$9.90 with the bill for the first full month after the entry of the Commission’s Final Order, and continuing for a total of two months, with the remainder of \$5.63 due as a bill credit in the third month’s bill.

E. Should there be any customers to whom a refund is due and owing and who are no longer Kaib and Kaib customers at the time of the entry of the Commission’s Final Order, such customers shall be provided their refund by way of a lump sum payment should current contact information for those past customers be readily available.

F. The total amount to be refunded by Kaib and Kaib to its customers is \$4,066.16.

G. In addition to refunds, Kaib and Kaib shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500) within 30 days of a Final Commission Order approving the Settlement.

H. Kaib and Kaib shall file compliance tariff(s), on at least one-day’s notice, as may be necessary to include the terms of this settlement in the company’s tariff.

41. Upon Commission approval of the Settlement in its entirety without modification, I&E will not file any complaints or initiate other action against Kaib and Kaib

at the Commission with respect to the allegations which were the subject of I&E's instant investigation.

42. I&E and Kaib and Kaib jointly acknowledge that approval of this Settlement Agreement is in the public interest and fully consistent with the Commission's Policy Statement regarding Factors and Standards for Evaluating Litigated and Settled Proceedings, 52 Pa. Code § 69.1201. The Parties submit that the Settlement Agreement is in the public interest because it effectively addresses I&E's allegations that are the subject of I&E's informal investigation and avoids the time and expense of litigation, which entails hearings, various expenses, and the preparation and filing of briefs, exceptions, and reply exceptions, as well as possible appeals. Attached as Appendix A and Appendix B are Statements in Support submitted by I&E and Kaib and Kaib, respectively setting forth the bases upon which the Parties believe the Settlement Agreement is in the public interest.

V. Conditions of Settlement

43. This document represents the Settlement Agreement in its entirety. No changes to obligations set forth herein may be made unless they are in writing and are expressly accepted by the parties involved. This Settlement Agreement shall be construed and interpreted under Pennsylvania law.

44. The Settlement is conditioned upon the Commission's approval of the terms and conditions contained in this Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement without modification. If the Commission modifies this Settlement Agreement, any party may elect to withdraw from this Settlement Agreement and may proceed with litigation or take such other action that is deemed appropriate and, in such event, this Settlement Agreement shall be void and of no effect. Such election to withdraw must be made in writing, filed with the Secretary of the Commission and served upon all parties within twenty (20) business days after entry of an Order modifying the Settlement.

45. The Parties agree that the underlying allegations were not the subject of any hearing or formal procedure and that there has been no order, findings of fact or conclusions of law rendered in this complaint proceeding. It is further understood that, by entering into this Settlement Agreement, Kaib and Kaib has made no concession or admission of fact or law and may dispute all issues of fact and law for all purposes in all proceedings that may arise as a result of the circumstances described in this Settlement Agreement.

46. The Parties acknowledge that this Settlement Agreement reflects a compromise of competing positions and does not necessarily reflect any party's position with respect to any issues raised in this proceeding.

47. This Settlement Agreement is being presented only in the context of this proceeding in an effort to resolve the

proceeding in a manner that is fair and reasonable. This Settlement Agreement is presented without prejudice to any position that any of the parties may have advanced and without prejudice to the position any of the parties may advance in the future on the merits of the issues in future proceedings, except to the extent necessary to effectuate the terms and conditions of this Settlement Agreement. This Settlement does not preclude the Parties from taking other positions in any other proceeding but is conclusive in this proceeding and may not be reasserted in any other proceeding or forum except for the limited purpose of enforcing the Settlement by a Party.

48. The terms and conditions of this Settlement Agreement constitute a carefully crafted package representing reasonably negotiated compromises on the issues addressed herein. Thus, the Settlement Agreement is consistent with the Commission's rules and practices encouraging negotiated settlements set forth in 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.231 and 69.1201.

Wherefore, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and Kaib and Kaib respectfully request that the Commission issue an Order approving the terms of this Settlement Agreement in their entirety as being in the public interest.

**STATEMENT OF
THE BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT IN SUPPORT OF THE JOINT PETITION FOR
APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT**

TO THE HONORABLE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

The Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement⁵ (“I&E”) offers the following Statement in Support of the Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement between Kaib and Kaib, LLC (“Kaib and Kaib” or “the Company”) and I&E (hereinafter referred to as the “Parties”) regarding Kaib and Kaib’s alleged violation of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 101 et seq. and Commission regulations.

I. Introduction

I&E is the entity established to prosecute complaints against public utilities and other entities subject to the Commission’s jurisdiction pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 308.2(a)(11); See Implementation of Act 129 of 2008; Organization of Bureaus and Offices, Docket No. M-2008-2071852 (Order entered August 11, 2011) (delegating authority to initiate proceedings that are prosecutory in nature to I&E).

Section 501(a) of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 501(a), authorizes and obligates the Commission to execute and enforce the provisions of the Code. Section 701 of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 701, authorizes the Commission, inter alia, to hear and determine complaints alleging a violation of any law or regulation that the Commission has jurisdiction to administer.

Kaib and Kaib is a “public utility” as that term is defined at 66 Pa.C.S. § 102 as it is engaged in providing public utility service as natural gas distribution company (“NGDC”) in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for compensation. Kaib and Kaib, as an NGDC, is subject to the power and authority of the Commission pursuant to Section 501(c) of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 501(c), which requires a public utility to comply with Commission regulations and orders.

Pursuant to Sections 331(a) and 506 of the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 331(a) and 506, and Section 3.113 of the Commission’s regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 3.113, Commission staff has the authority to conduct informal investigations or informal proceedings in order to gather data and/or to substantiate allegations of potential violations of the Commission’s regulations.

I&E-Enforcement instituted an informal investigation of Kaib and Kaib based on information referred to I&E-Enforcement by the Commission in its June 13, 2024, Order, at Docket No. R-2023-3043594, granting a tariff revision to Kaib and Kaib. As discussed in more detail in the Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement, Kaib and Kaib’s tariff revision, filed on January 10, 2024, contained a financial discrepancy.

I&E determined that this referral warranted further investigation to examine whether the actions of Kaib and Kaib violated the Code and Commission regulations. Thereafter, on August 15, 2024, I&E sent Kaib and Kaib a Data Request, to which the utility responded on September 20, 2024. After a thorough review of the case and discussion with counsel for Kaib and Kaib, the Parties have reached mutually agreeable settlement terms and believe that it is in the public interest to settle the matter.

II. Summary of Settlement

The Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement (“Settlement”) resolves all outstanding alleged violations of the Code and Commission regulations stemming from Kaib and Kaib’s alleged failure to adhere to its tariff rate for the customer service charge by billing its customers \$7.50 per month from August 2019 to May 2024 when its tariff rate was \$5.50 per month. The customer service charge billed by Kaib and Kaib was an amount that was in excess of the legally permitted rate, in violation of 66 Pa.C.S. § 1303.

Under the terms of the Settlement:

A) Kaib and Kaib shall refund those 45 customers who have had accounts with Kaib and Kaib since August 2019 or before the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 42 months, plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$4,006.80.

B) Kaib and Kaib shall refund each of its 45 customers by providing each such customer with a monthly bill credit of \$9.90, starting with the first full month after the entry of the Commission’s Final Order, and continuing for eight months, with the ninth and final month’s bill credit being \$9.84.

C) Kaib and Kaib shall refund the customer who had an account since February 2023 (identified as Meter 50 in the Response to I&E’s Data Request—Set I) the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 16 months (encompassing the period of February 2023 to May 2024), plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$33.92. The Meter 50 customer shall receive a bill credit of \$9.90 with the bill for the first full month after the entry of the Commission’s Final Order, and continuing for a total of three months, with the remainder of \$4.22 due as a bill credit in the fourth month’s bill.

D) Kaib and Kaib shall refund the customer who had an account since May 2023 (identified as Meter 51 in the Response to I&E’s Data Request—Set I) the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 12 months (encompassing the period of May 2023 to May 2024), plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$25.44. The Meter 51 customer shall receive a bill credit of \$9.90 with the bill for the first full month after the entry of the Commission’s Final Order, and continuing for a total of two months, with the remainder of \$5.63 due as a bill credit in the third month’s bill.

E) Should there be any customers to whom a refund is due and owing and who are no longer Kaib and Kaib customers at the time of the entry of the Commission’s Final Order, such customers shall be provided their refund by way of a lump sum payment should current contact information for those past customers be readily available.

F) The total amount to be refunded by Kaib and Kaib to its customers is \$4,066.16.

G) In addition to refunds, Kaib and Kaib shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500) within 30 days of a Final Commission Order approving the Settlement.

H) Kaib and Kaib shall file compliance tariff(s), on at least one-day's notice, as may be necessary to include the terms of this settlement in the company's tariff.

III. *The Settlement is in the Public Interest and Satisfies the Rosi Factors to Determine the Appropriate Civil Penalty*

Section 3301(a) of the Code provides that a public utility, or any other person or entity subject to the Code, that violates any part of the Code is subject to a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per violation. 66 Pa.C.S. § 3301(a). The Code further provides that each and every day's continuance in the violation of the Code or any regulation, order, judgment, or decree shall be a separate and distinct offense. 66 Pa.C.S. § 3301(b).

The Commission's Policy Statement regarding Factors and Standards for Evaluating Litigated and Settled Proceedings, 52 Pa. Code § 69.1201, lists the following factors which the Commission shall consider in determining the appropriate civil penalty as well as whether the Settlement is in the public interest:

1) Whether the conduct at issue was of a serious nature. When conduct of a serious nature is involved, such as willful fraud or misrepresentation, the conduct may warrant a higher penalty. When the conduct is less egregious, such as administrative filing or technical errors, it may warrant a lower penalty.

2) Whether the resulting consequences of the conduct at issue were of a serious nature. When consequences of a serious nature are involved, such as personal injury or property damage, the consequences may warrant a higher penalty.

3) Whether the conduct at issue was deemed intentional or negligent. This factor may only be considered in evaluating litigated cases. When conduct has been deemed intentional, the conduct may result in a higher penalty.

4) Whether the regulated entity made efforts to modify internal practices and procedures to address the conduct at issue and prevent similar conduct in the future. These modifications may include activities such as training and improving company techniques and supervision. The amount of time it took the utility to correct the conduct once it was discovered and the involvement of top-level management in correcting the conduct may be considered.

5) The number of customers affected and the duration of the violation.

6) The compliance history of the regulated entity which committed the violation. An isolated incident from an otherwise compliant utility may result in a lower penalty, whereas frequent, recurrent violations by a utility may result in a higher penalty.

7) Whether the regulated entity cooperated with the Commission's investigation. Facts establishing bad faith, active concealment of violations, or attempts to interfere with Commission investigations may result in a higher penalty.

8) The amount of the civil penalty or fine necessary to deter future violations. The size of the utility may be considered to determine an appropriate penalty amount.

9) Past Commission decisions in similar situations.

10) Other relevant factors.

52 Pa. Code § 69.1201(c).

Regarding the first factor, the conduct at issue was intentional. As explained in the Joint Petition at paragraph 31, the utility handwrote "\$7.50" as the service charge on each bill that was provided to I&E to review. This conduct is serious because it misrepresented the tariffed service charge to its customers, increasing it by \$2.00 per bill. According to information supplied by Kaib and Kaib to I&E, an increase to its service charge without first seeking approval of the Commission was done to avoid financial loss.

The consequences of the conduct—the second *Rosi* factor—were also serious. Because of the overcharging of the service charge, most of Kaib and Kaib's customers (with the exception of a few customers, as explained in the Joint Petition), overpaid Kaib and Kaib by \$24.00 per year.

The third factor, whether the conduct at issue was intentional or negligent, is not relevant here, as this factor "may only be considered in evaluating litigated cases." Here, the Parties have reached a settlement.

Regarding the fourth factor, Kaib and Kaib has committed to modifying its internal practices and procedures to avoid the conduct at issue and prevent future incidents—namely, seeking Commission approval before altering what the utility charges to customers. In fact, prior to the investigation by I&E, Kaib and Kaib had successfully petitioned the Commission to change its tariff.

Additionally, Kaib and Kaib will refund its customers 42 months' worth of service charge overpayments to customers who have had accounts since August 2019 (45 customers), and two other customers 12 months' and 16 months' worth of service charge overpayments, respectively, as those two customers have had accounts with Kaib and Kaib for a shorter period of time.

The fifth factor is the number of customers affected and the duration of the violation. The number of customers affected is small in number but large in proportion to Kaib and Kaib's total customer base. Kaib and Kaib has 47 paying customers, all of whom were overcharged.

As to compliance history, the sixth *Rosi* factor, Kaib and Kaib has not been the subject of any enforcement action and has a good compliance history.

Kaib and Kaib cooperated with I&E during the course of this investigation and was forthcoming about its overcharging.

In the view of I&E, a civil penalty of \$500.00 and 42 months' of refunding the overcharged service fee for 45 customers and a complete return of the overcharged service fee to the two more recent customers is a fair outcome and is in the public interest. A refund to its customers and a small civil penalty that allows Kaib and Kaib to maintain gas service is preferable to a large civil penalty that may be onerous and jeopardize the operation of the utility. Kaib and Kaib is a small gas utility in a rural area and a larger civil penalty would not serve the public interest.

IV. Conclusion

The Settlement is a fair and reasonable compromise between the Parties. Had this matter proceeded to litigation, Kaib and Kaib would have disputed the allegations in the Complaint and I&E would have been required to expend staff time and resources to prepare for and participate in the hearing. Aside from avoiding litigation, the Settlement is in the public interest because the agreed-upon civil penalty is sufficient to ensure that Kaib and Kaib's future compliance with the Section 1303 of the Code requiring that only the tariffed rate be charged to customers.

For the reasons set forth above, the Commission should approve the Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement, without modification.

PROPOSED ORDERING PARAGRAPHS

1. That the Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement filed on June 6, 2025, between the Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and Kaib and Kaib, LLC ("Kaib and Kaib") is approved in its entirety without modification.

2. Kaib and Kaib shall refund those 45 customers who have had accounts with Kaib and Kaib since August 2019 or before the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 42 months, plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$4,006.80.

3. Kaib and Kaib shall refund each of its 45 customers by providing each such customer with a monthly bill credit of \$9.90, starting with the first full month after the entry of the Commission's Final Order, and continuing for eight months, with the ninth and final month's bill credit being \$9.84.

4. Kaib and Kaib shall refund the customer who had an account since February 2023 (identified as Meter 50 in the Response to I&E's Data Request—Set I) the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 16 months (encompassing the period of February 2023 to May 2024), plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$33.92. The Meter 50 customer shall receive a bill credit of \$9.90 with the bill for the first full month after the entry of the Commission's Final Order, and continuing for a total of three months, with the remainder of \$4.22 due as a bill credit in the fourth month's bill.

5. Kaib and Kaib shall refund the customer who had an account since May 2023 (identified as Meter 51 in the Response to I&E's Data Request—Set I) the amount of the overcharge (\$2.00) for 12 months (encompassing the period of May 2023 to May 2024), plus interest. This amount is calculated at \$25.44. The Meter 51 customer shall receive a bill credit of \$9.90 with the bill for the first full month after the entry of the Commission's Final

Order, and continuing for a total of two months, with the remainder of \$5.63 due as a bill credit in the third month's bill.

6. Should there be any customers to whom a refund is due and owing and who are no longer Kaib and Kaib customers at the time of the entry of the Commission's Final Order, such customers shall be provided their refund by way of a lump sum payment should current contact information for those past customers be readily available.

7. The total amount to be refunded by Kaib and Kaib to its customers shall be \$4,066.16.

8. In addition to refunds, Kaib and Kaib shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500) within 30 days of a Final Commission Order approving the Settlement. The civil penalty shall be payable to the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania" and directed to:

9. Kaib and Kaib shall file compliance tariff(s), on at least one-day's notice, as may be necessary to include the terms of this settlement in the company's tariff.

10. That the civil penalty shall not be tax deductible under Section 162(f) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C.S. § 162(f).

11. A copy of this Opinion and Order shall be served upon the Financial and Assessment Chief, Office of Administrative Services.

12. That the above-captioned matter shall be marked closed upon completion of Kaib and Kaib's provision of refunds to its customers in accordance with the plan for providing refunds in the Settlement and this Order.
